Past District Governor Maria Pappas took the revision of the "Blue Book" as her project. Sister Nasha Maniskas-Hamra, assisted by Sister Tina Poulos-Kasidonis volunteered to undertake this project. They put many hours in getting this book revised and updated to the year 1991.

Past District Governor Marilyn Hatfield inherited this project during her term of office and had hoped for completion of the "Blue Book." She appointed the Past District Governors' Club, with Sister Helen Troullos as Chairman, to critique the information we had to that point.

Past District Governor Maria Theofilos also had this as a project during her term of office. Sister Marilyn presented a draft of the book to each PDG present at their breakfast meeting to critique. Sisters Helen & Marilyn did not hear from any of the PDG's. There was still a lot of clean-up work to complete, including the minutes from 1991, and 1992 to enter.

Past District Governor Betty Karageorge thought this project would be completed during her term, but due to circumstances this was not to be. At the convention in North Royalton, PDG'S Helen Troullos and Marilyn Hatfield offered to up-date, print/copy, supply the paper and notebooks for the book, and present 26 copies of the completed book at the 1995 District Convention in Cincinnati.

District Governor Linda Mouhlas has been able to have the By-Laws and Archives completed during her term of office. It is up-dated thur the year 1993.

Helen and Marilyn would like to thank everyone who helped get this project completed, especially Nasha and Tina. It has been a big undertaking. We sincerely hope that each future District Governor will keep the "By-laws and Archives" up-dated during their term of office.

Minutes of First Meeting
November 16, 1929

The first meeting of the Daughters of Penelope was called to order at 9 p.m., Saturday, November 16, 1929, by Mrs. Emanuel Apostolides, acting as temporary chairman. The meeting was held at the home of Mrs. Apostolides.

Brothers of the Golden Gates Chapter, Order of Ahepa, were present to assist in the organization of our chapter. Dr Emanuel Apostolides, President of the Golden Gate Chapter, spoke to us and gave us suggestions on how to go about establishing our chapter. He suggested we form a petition and write headquarters of Ahepa in Washington, D.C.

Mr. William Petros, Vice President of the Golden Gate Chapter of Ahepa, next spoke to us about the necessity of forming our chapter, *to work side by side with the fathers, brothers and friends of Ahepa. "Religion, honor and reputation are the basic principles of Ahepa, and only by effort and conscientious work will we attain that which we have set out to do." Our chapter is to be a secret organization and only by maintaining secrecy will we succeed.*

A secret ballot was next held for a name of our chapter. The result was as follows: 8 votes - EOS; 1 vote - San Francisco; 2 votes - Cleo; 1 vote - Electra.

EOS is now the name of our chapter and EOS means "*The Dawn.*"

Mrs. Emanuel Apostolides next read the Constitution and the By-Laws which were approved with few changes made. A dispute arising as to what should be the proper initiation fee and the yearly dues, a vote was held and the result was \$2.50 initiation fee; \$3.00 yearly dues.

The CHARTER MEMBERS present were Mrs. E. Apostolides, Miss B. Canellos, Mrs. E. N. Sekeotis, Mrs. William Petros, Mrs. George Athan, Miss E. C. Pantazy, Mrs. E. C. Pantazy, Mrs. A. Kaddas, Mrs. George Bell, Mrs. E. Kovellas, Mrs. M. Demetrios, Mrs. R. Nicholson, and Mrs. U. Kerhulas.

An election was held next for the officers of the club. Results were as follows: Mrs. E. Apostolides, President; Miss B. Canellos, Vice President; Miss E. Pantazy, Secretary, and Mrs. T. Choppelas, Treasurer.

Governors elected were Mrs Kaddas, Mrs. B. George Bell, Mrs. Sophie Canellos, and Mrs. William Petros.

The following were appointed by the President: Mrs. E. N. Sekeotis, Priestess; Mrs. R. Nicholson, Warden; Mrs. M. Demetrios, Outside Sentinel; Mrs. C. J. Pantazy, Inside Sentinel; Mrs. U. Kerhulas, Captain of the Guards; Mrs. T. Choppelas, Organizer; and Mrs. A. Kaddas, Organizer.

Dr. Apostolides informed us that he would get application blanks from headquarters. He also said that he would get names from members of the Ahepa of their wives and daughters so that the organizers could talk to them to join. In that way we would know whom to start (initiate) on first. It was further agreed that at our next meeting we were to discuss our emblem, fez, swords, motto of our Chapter, the Priestess' Oath, etc. The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 p.m. after a motion was made and seconded.

ALL CHAPTERS, GREETINGS:

Dear Sisters:

Enclosed, is an exact copy of the "legislation" discussed by some Delegates at Ahepa's 1938 National Convention. You will notice that the last paragraph, the most important, was DELETED- which means "struck out", "destroyed", "made null, void".

Hence, we are exactly where we were before the convention! Hence, any rumor that any of you may have heard from any one, to the effect that our Brothers were to return home from the convention and to "discourage the establishment of any new Chapter" is false...and any one spreading such a false rumor is, really, disloyal to the ideals of Ahepanism and Americanism! It was such a false rumor that caused a great deal of disturbance among some of us, sad to say. And yet, it was this same rumor, marvelous to relate, that caused many of our inactive members to sit up and take notice and "to come back"! But it is a great pity that some of us still govern our activities by rumors....this should NEVER be in our Sisterhood. I hope that it may NEVER recur.

As you know, likewise, from our last Circular letter, we communicated with Ahepa Headquarters, asking for DEFINITE, DETAILED, information concerning the proposed "direct jurisdiction" of Ahepa over our Order, which some of our chapters have expressed their desire to acquire. We were informed by the Supreme Secretary, Brother Maniates;

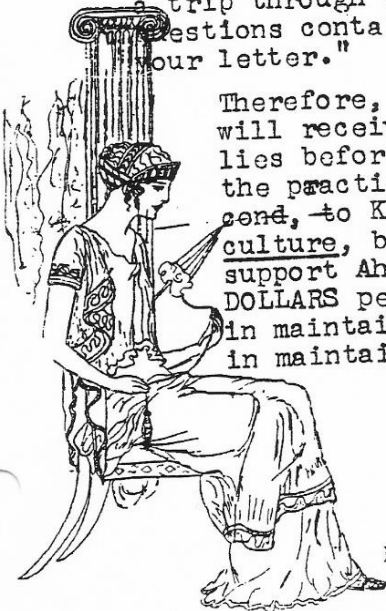
"As soon as our Supreme President, Mr. Chebithes, returns from a trip through the New England states, I will take up with him the questions contained in your letter of October 17th," and reply to your letter."

Therefore, we have done our duty, I think, in this matter. You will receive this information as soon as we get it. Now, what lies before our chapters? First, to KEEP ON in our Sisterhood, the practice of our MOTTO, and the creating of FRIENDSHIP; second, to KEEP ON supporting Ahepa's Ideals of American-Hellenic culture, by pursuing EDUCATIONAL ideals ourselves; and third, to support Ahepa's Sanatorium, by donating the minimum of FIVE DOLLARS per year, per chapter. And last, but foremost, to KEEP ON in maintaining a spirit of Give-and-Take, of infinite insistence in maintaining the Dignity of Noble Womanhood.

(6) That the national Advisor to the Maids of Athena be an elected office of the Daughters of Penelope Grand Lodge.

(7) That the district Advisor to the Maids of Athena be an elected office of the Daughters of Penelope District Lodge.

39TH CONVENTION YOUNGSTOWN, OH - 1977

(1) Page 33 Article 18, section 10:

Delete present paragraph. Insert, "All past District Governors in good standing with their chapters shall be seated at the convention with one full vote."

Add the following: "If a District Governor's chapter is placed inactive, the District Governor receive all information National and District Lodges and she shall retain her privilege to vote at District Convention. Her credentials shall be signed by the District Governor and District Secretary."

41ST CONVENTION COLUMBUS, OH - 1978

(1) Chapter officer elections be held in May, so that the tenure of chapter officers run concurrently with District and Supreme Lodge Officers. **(Motion passed at National)**

43RD CONVENTION CINCINNATI, OH - 1980

(1) A 30 year pin be designed and made available for purchase by the chapters.

45TH CONVENTION CAMBRIDGE, OH - 1982

(1) Whereas, registration fee is becoming prohibitive, and whereas tickets included in the "book" are not desired by the average delegate; be it resolved that only the Grand Banquet ticket and the album be included as the basis for the registration fee for the Supreme convention.

50TH CONVENTION WARREN, OH - 1987

(1) Whereas, we feel that the \$50 assessment to national imposed on the chapters is uncalled for. The small chapters are pressed for money. Eventually, small chapters become inactive. It is time that national begins functioning within a smaller budget and stop devising new ways of drawing money from the chapters.

(2) Whereas, it is our understanding that all our donations are placed in the Penelope Foundation, we, therefore would like to have an accounting of each donation per chapter and how much was sent to each charity. There is an implication that only a certain percent is sent to the designated charities.

52nd CONVENTION WHEELING, WV- 1989

(1) Whereas, the age limit for the Maids of Athena currently stands at 23 years old and whereas the age limit for the Sons of Pericles stands at 24 years old, be it resolved that the age limit of the Maids of Athena be raised to 24 years old excluding officers, whom will be able to finish out their term of office.

(2) Whereas, the national Chapter assessment is a hardship on chapters with limited funds, be it resolved that the national chapter assessment be eliminated or dropped for one year.

(3) Whereas, the Maids of Athena is a junior order of the Daughters of Penelope and whereas, the Daughters of Penelope pay per capita tax of \$10 per member to national headquarters and a national assessment fee of \$50, be it therefore resolved that the Maids of Athena's per capita tax be the same as or less than that of the Daughters of Penelope and that the national assessment fee be the same as or less than that of the Daughters of Penelope and whereas the \$5 per member assessment by Maids of Athena to national headquarters is a \$5 increase in per capita tax in disguise, be it therefore resolve that said \$5 per member chapter assessment be eliminated.

(4) Whereas the chapter's annual board of governors report was done in January to correspond with the term of office of Chapter officers be it therefore resolved that the annual board of governors report be completed in June or at the end of the term of office of chapter officers.

(5.) Whereas balloting conflicts with the spirit of co-operation and the oath and obligation of our order, be it therefore resolved that balloting new members be eliminated.

53rd CONVENTION AKRON, OH- 1990

(1) Whereas the Youngstown Chapter has the desire to initiate a talented, worthy candidate into their chapter and whereas the candidate is hearing impaired, by it resolved that this district go on record to support any legislation that would allow an interpreter to attend ritualistic meetings of the Daughters of Penelope.

55th CONVENTION AKRON, OH- 1992

Recommendations:

- (1) That ritualistic meeting requirements be changed from 9 to 3.
- (2) That the Daughters should have a say at the AHEPAN meeting where the convention is to be held.
- (3) Allowing Non-Greek or Non-Greek related women into the Daughters
- (4) Replacing the rite of initiation with a simple oath.
- (5) Change the word "secret" in Secret Organization.

56th CONVENTION AKRON, OH- 1993

Recommendations:

Be it recommended the Board of the Penelope Foundation be elected by the National Convention body (Except Grand President, Grand VP, and Grand VP of Canada). The Board will consist of 12 members. Their term of office will be (2) years. Not more than two (2) consecutive terms may be served in six years. The Board shall consist of the Grand Lodge officers, four past District Governors and two members at large. Five members (one from each category) will be elected each year. Clarification: If you have been a Past District Governor then you may not serve as a member at large. If you have been a Grand Lodge officer you may not serve as Past District Governor. You must serve on the Board at the highest level of office to which you have been previously elected.

Whereas the Past District Governors of the Daughters of Penelope must attend four (4) chapter meetings to be given a sovereign vote regardless of meetings attended, be it resolve that the past district governors of the Daughters of Penelope be given the same courtesy of the sovereign vote as the order of AHEPA past district governors.

Whereas AHEPA headquarters is not fulfilling their obligation of reimbursements of convention rebates to the chapters, which is a burden to the districts and whereas they are not maintaining autonomous accounts for the monies of the DOP and whereas they are experiencing financial difficulty and furthermore, because we are an auxiliary and therefore appear to be subservient to their Order of AHEPA, they can make our passed resolutions to hire our own account null and void, be it resolved that the incoming Grand Lodge appoint a committee preferable representative of attorneys who are members of the DOP to investigate, prepare and issue a comprehensive report at the 1994 Supreme convention and be it further resolved for better accountability and autonomy that this committee explore the legal ramifications of converting our membership from auxiliary to affiliate status.

57th CONVENTION NORTH ROYALTON, OH- 1994

Recommendations:

Whereas the AHEPA allows philhellenes into its membership, whereas the membership in the Daughters of Penelope is declining, whereas we are approaching the 21st century and we need to progress with the changing times, whereas there must be two sponsors who are members in good standing of the Daughters of Penelope and upon their sponsorship the applicant will be considered for membership in the DOP. Therefore, be it resolved applications for membership from philhellenes to DOP as stated in our constitutions read in Article V, section 1 and inserting the words "or is a philhellene".

60th CONVENTION CLEVELAND, OH- 1997

Recommendations to National:

- (1) No presiding Grand President may name/appoint herself as Chairman of a committee for the following year.
- (2) Whereas our culture is seriously jeopardized and membership is dwindling, be it resolved that Hellenic descent be eliminated as a qualification for membership and replaced with Christian female.
- (3) Whereas secrecy has been eliminated, the password should be eliminated, and the membership card should be used in its place.
- (4) Whereas the altar has been removed, the term priestess should be replaced with chaplain.

61st CONVENTION CLEVELAND, OH- 1998

The following resolutions were passed and forwarded to National:

- (1) Whereas in Daughters of Penelope chapters where there are no Maids of Athena chapters, be it resolved that the chapter vice president be designated to receive all District and national maids correspondence and be the designee responsible for initiating a Maids of Athena chapter.
- (2) Be it resolved that it be written in subsection____, page 37 under section 8 dealing with finance, the absolute dates of Sept 1st to August 31 be the fiscal year for the Daughters of Penelope.

In the case of a member who has been a member for a period of four (4) months and current year's due have been paid and she has attended at least four(4) business meetings prior to the election of delegates, she shall be eligible to service as a delegate or alternate.

Rationale: The constitution does not address this specifically Newer Members are confusing a membership year with requirements for a delegate in good standing. They add calendar years to arrive at the number of years without regard to the date and month.

86th CONVENTION CINCINNATI, OH- 2014

ARTICLE XXI, SECTION 7

Currently reads: "Additional chapters in the same city. No chapter shall be established in any city or town where there is already a Chapter or Chapters of this Order, unless there is a petition by at least 25 or more women who are not, or ever have been members of any other Chapter, and the District Lodge consents to the establishment of such additional Chapter...

PROPOSED CHANGE: 25 to 8

If adopted should read: "Additional Chapters in the same city...at least 8 or more women"

RATIONALE:

The required number of members required to start a chapter has now been reduced to (8). This number should be reduced accordingly. Passed

ARTICLE XVII, SECTION 11. FINANCES, b

Currently reads: "A portion from each delegate of the District attending the Supreme Convention."

PROPOSED CHANGE: eliminate b and make c, b

If adopted, will read nothing

RATIONALE: It has been several years since the Headquarters of the Grand Lodge made this remittance to the Districts. It was adopted at a Supreme Convention to discontinue the remittance.

Passed

ARTICLE XXII, SECTION 3. CHAIRMAN BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Currently reads: "The Chairman of the Board of Governors shall be the retiring President of the Chapter, except in the case of a new Chapter, when the members thereof shall elect 5 Governors, and the Chairman will be the member receiving the largest number of votes cast..."

PROPOSED CHANGE: ...shall elect (3) to (5) Governors...

RATIONALE: Section 1 states that the Board of governors be made up of not more than five(5) and no less than three(3) members. The change in section 3 would make it consistent. Passed

ARTICLE XXII, SECTION 6. TERM OF OFFICE

Currently reads: The officer of the Chapter shall serve a term of eight months, or until their successors are elected and qualified

PROPOSED CHANGE: Change 8 to 12 months

If adopted will read: The officers of the Chapter shall serve a term of 12 months, or until their successors are elected.

RATIONALE: From the time an officer is installed until the new officer is installed, is a period of one year, 12 months. Even though Chapter meetings are usually held from September through June, officers serve the Chapters during July and August whether installed in June or September.

PROPOSED LEGISLATIVE CHANGE: for District 11 By-laws.

The Constitution states that elections of officers take place in April, May , or June. District 11 conventions take place in June. Currently some chapters have their elections in June.

Be it resolved that the election of officers in District 11 take place in April or May and all District forms be sent to the Governor & District Secretary by the end of May.

RATIONALE: Chapters are sending in their forms to the Governor and Secretary as late as the third week of June. With the District Convention in June, the District Secretary needs the information so that the Agenda Book can be printed on time and the Governor needs the forms to determine the chapter awards.

ARTICLE XXII, SECTION 4. TIME & ELECTION OF CHAPTER OFFICERS

Currently reads: a. All elective officers of a Chapter shall be elected at the first regular meeting in April, May, or June of each year and upon administration of the oath of office shall assume their respective duties.

PROPOSED CHANGE: Change to in April or May

If adopted will read: All elected officers of a Chapter shall be elected at the first regular meeting in April or May of each year and upon administration of the oath of office shall assume their respective duties.

RATIONALE: District Conventions are held at the end of May or anytime in June. Chapter officers should be elected prior to the convention in order to represent their Chapter in their official capacity as a delegate and take back any new information. Passed

87th CONVENTION CANTON, OH- 2015

ARTICLE XXIII, SECTION 4 PAGE 47

Currently reads: She will keep minutes of all meetings

PROPOSED CHANGE: She will keep minutes of all meetings which may be stored electronically

RATIONAL: In order to be current in communication, the DOP needs to utilize today's electronic storage methods. In addition, binding minutes is very costly and storage space is scarce.

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE X SECTION 1C PAGE 11

Currently Reads: or any other committee Standing or Special as it may be deemed necessary to expedite the work of the Daughters of Penelope.

PROPOSED CHANGE: Add the following: to include projects and not exceed one mandatory as voted by the delegation of the Supreme Convention.

RATIONALE: It gives greater national recognition to the Daughters of Penelope. In addition, it allows chapters and districts to support their own communities.

If adopted will read: or any other committee Standing or Special as it may be deemed necessary to expedite the work of the Daughters of Penelope to include projects and not exceed one mandatory as voted by the delegation of the Supreme Convention.

PROPOSED CHANGE: To be initiated, she shall be eligible from the age of fourteen(14) through the age of twenty-seven(27).

If adopted will read: To be initiated, she shall be eligible from the age of fourteen(14) through the age of twenty-seven(27).

RATIONALE: Currently, a young women between the ages of twenty three(23) to twenty eight (28) cannot be initiated into the MOA and be active, such as to serve in a leadership capacity on the District or Grand Lodge. Yet, as these young ladies mature, they are precisely the individuals who should be encouraged to become more active in the MOA and assume leadership positions. As dual members in the DOP from age 23+, these young ladies gaining leadership experience in the MOA are great assets to the DOP.

2. DOP District #11 By-laws Proposed Change:

The Governors' Ball has traditionally been hosted by the AHEPA District Governor's Chapter, which is often the same location as the District Convention. Sponsoring these events is increasingly a financial burden and a strain on members' time to plan and implement the Governors' Ball as well as the Convention. The Governor's Ball could be combined with the Grand Banquet held on the Saturday night of the District Convention. Individual chapters can still sponsor a Governors' Ball if that chapter so wishes. The Grand Banquet on the last night of the District Convention is already in honor of the District Governors of all the AHEPA Family.

We left the current process for those chapters who want to continue to mail the information, but adde the email for those who would prefer to email the information.

It was moved that the budget has an appropriate amount to put \$500 of the existing \$700 balance into the savings account before the books are closed.

51st LOUISVILLE, KY

1988

1. We move to reinstate the District Raffle project for next year with funds to be directed to the Treasury General Operation Fund to be used to pay the chapter's assessment fees to district lodge.
2. Moved that the anticipated income generated from the pro rata shares be increased to \$1350 and accordingly that the postage allocation be increased by \$100 making it a total of \$200.

59th WARREN, OH

1996

Motioned and Passed to move \$500 from checking to savings to be added to the \$1000 Certificate of Deposit bringing the amount to \$1500.

67th CANTON, OH

2004

A motion was made to give the District Governor or her representative to the Biennial Banquet in Washington DC a \$200 stipend toward travel cost. **Motion passed.**

A second motion was made to budget \$50 per year for a \$100 payout for an ad for the Salute to Women. **Motion passed.**

70th COLUMBUS, OH

2007

A CD valued at \$2149 was cashed and a new CD valued at \$1000 was to be purchased.

80th COLUMBUS, OH

2008

Motioned and passed that each Chapter should be given the option to either participate in the District Lodge fundraising project or the Chapter shall pay a predetermined amount of money to the District for not participating in the District Lodge fundraiser.

84th CANTON, OH

2012

Proposal to increase Chapter Assessments as follows:

10-30 members - \$60

31-50 members - \$80

51-70 members - \$100

71-90 members \$120

The paid members would be as of May 31 of the year, not November 30. The Assessments are due to the District on December 1. **Motion passed.**

RITUALS

36th CLEVELAND, OH- 1973

When Grand Lodge and/or District Lodge officers are present they remove their jewels at the same time as the President and the Vice President remove their jewels. The jewel is neatly folded and draped over the left hand until the President declares the meeting closed.

37th WHEELING, WV- 1974

To be presented to National for consideration. The following paragraph be inserted in the Book of Rituals following the seating of the members by the President.

"If there is anyone present who is not a duly initiated member of the Daughters of Penelope, will they please retire."

44th WHEELING, WV- 1981

Revision of Funeral Services with all sisters using the jewel of her office, candles, a short personal eulogy included into the service of the President of the chapter after the priest at calling hours. A eulogy be made mandatory for all our deceased sisters.

46th COLUMBUS, OH- 1983

The number of required ritualistic meetings be changed from current nine times to six times a year. The reason: To allow the chapters to offer various types of events to encourage increased attendance at meetings and still meet the ritual obligations.

66th DAYTON, OH- 2003

On page 7 in the Book of Rituals under "closing ceremonies" where the prayer ends with "for greater accomplishments in they name" the typographical error be corrected to read "in thy name".

82nd NORTH ROYALTON, OH- 2010

In Ritual Book on page 35 under Chapter Room Etiquette it states on the second bullet: "Knitting, smoking, chewing gum, hats, gloves are not permitted. Please remove "hats and gloves" from that sentence. **Motion passed at National.**

91ST YOUNGSTOWN, OH 2019

A legislation request from Polydama #111 to change the constitution and rituals for the title of "Priestess" to "Prayer Leader". The request was not in the required "Proposed Legislative Change Form" due June 1. It was recommended the matter go back to the Chapter to complete the proper form and resubmit at a future convention.

- (2) Where as the District Project of the Daughters of Penelope for the year 1980-81 be the Ellen Lagos Fund of the Buckeye District Scholarship Foundation. Each chapter's mandatory funds toward the District Project, be earmarked for one year only, for the Ellen Lagos Fund, thus eliminating further mandatory contributions to the general foundation. This project will be instrumental in augmenting the balance of the Ellen Lagos Memorial Fund which now stands at \$830. The increased funds being channeled into the balance will help realize the Ellen Lagos Scholarship in the near future.
- (3) \$30 Ellen Lagos scholarship assessment still in effect.

1. Develop the application.
2. Select a panel of judges to determine scholarship recipient.
3. Develop communications to members to acknowledge availability of scholarship.
4. Determine amount of scholarship and all pertinent information relating to it: name, place of award, criteria necessary, rules and regulations, etc.
5. Determine means of securing funds for scholarship.
6. All points be approved by the current District Lodge and appointed committee.

IV. That the award be in perpetuity, each recipient must apply annually.

GUIDELINES

Guidelines or the committee to observe in formulating the realization of this program.

PROCEDURES

1. To commence immediately in developing for ways and means by raising necessary money to sustain in perpetuity the Buckeye Re-entry Scholarship.
2. All monies to be deposited in a separate account specifically earmarked for that purpose.
3. One annual award of undisclosed amount will be provided annually the balance of the monies raised will be deposited to accumulate interest for future scholarship.
4. Funds will be raised annually until this scholarship program becomes self-sustaining; from these funds each year one scholarship shall be awarded.
5. That the committee formulated be an elected standing committee. Election procedures to be determined by the Current District Lodge.
6. That the scholarship be named to honor another of the three past Grand Presidents that the Buckeye District has the distinction in recognizing.(See Projects 1984)

37TH AKRON, OHIO 1975

1. The Optimum performance Award which is awarded to the most improved chapter be awarded a plaque rather than a trophy. The name changed back to the "Most Improved Chapter".
2. The Lambro Award be revised:
 - a. The Lambro Cup be retired.
 - b. The Outstanding Chapter be awarded a trophy to possess permanently.
 - c. The name of the trophy to be changed from "Lambro Cup" to the "Florence Stathopoulos Award".

Upon passage or rejection at National these motions should be so marked on the sheet by the District Governor and reported at the conclave. A reference booklet will be made and kept by the governor including these sheets and passed on to the succeeding governor from year to year.

29TH COLUMBUS, OHIO 1966

1. A list and attendance record of District convention delegates be included with the minutes of the district convention each year.
2. The number of votes be recorded in our minutes of the elections.
3. The cost of the Convention Booklet is not to exceed \$40 to be printed by an outside source.

31ST MIDDLETOWN, OHIO 1968

1. The four(4) District Governors be given complimentary tickets and free rooms by the Convention City Hosts and that Supreme and Grand Lodge officers travel per diem and should not take the limelight away from District Officers at District Conventions.
2. Daughters of Penelope Convention Committees must be confirmed with AHEPA before plans are made final.
3. All District conventions will be held some time other than the third weekend of June as that is Father's Day.
4. Chapter activities be more specific on committee reports and ritualistic meetings not be included. A note should be included to all chapters instruction them to be as brief as possible and what to include in the report.
5. All Past District Governors meet and review past convention minutes and set up by-laws and bring all resolutions to order.

33RD ELYRIA-LORAIN, OHIO 1970

The District Scholarship Foundation Report and Financial Statement be included in the minutes of the convention and sent to every chapter.

35TH DAYTON, OHIO 1972

1. Convention committee reports shall be compiled at work sessions at the convention. These work sessions will be on a trial basis for two years.
2. The style show during the luncheon at the District Convention is to be discontinued.

3. The Convention committee consider a special financial consideration to youth at their discretion and with the approval of the District Lodge, this pertaining to the social function.

41ST COLUMBUS, OHIO 1978

1. Chapter assignments revised as follows:
 - a. Finance & Budget
 - b. Daughters & Maids Relations
 - c. Memorial Service
 - d. Education
 - e. District Project
 - f. Good of the Order
 - g. AHEPA - DOP Relations
 - h. Legislative
 - i. Grievance
2. A compilation of by-laws and legislation passed will be prepared for chapters and delegates use at conventions and the cost will not exceed \$50
3. District Convention officers are to be elected on Friday night immediately after the opening of the convention
4. An AHEPA family lodge meeting be held immediately following elections, so a program can be planned well in advance.

46TH COLUMBUS, OHIO 1983

1. Dues cards be shown at all district and national conventions because non members have been attending the meetings.
2. Delegates must attend 4 meetings to be a delegate to the District Convention.

48TH NORTH ROYALTON, OHIO 1985

Whereas the Daughters who faithfully attend their meetings and other AHEPA family functions should be rightfully acknowledged at the District Conventions, be it therefore resolved that a list of delegates be included in the convention booklet.

53RD AKRON, OHIO 1990

Next year the names and cities of all scholarship winners will be read during the luncheon.

81ST CANTON, OHIO 2009

1. AHEPA family relations be established as a standing committee within the Chapter and listed in the District by-laws under Standing Committees.
2. This resolution also be include in the DOP Constitution, Article 23, Section 2H, page 46.
3. ARTICLE XXII, Section 6, under terms of office be delete and changed to read:
"All officers of the chapter shall serve for a term of twelve(12) months. Any officer can be eligible to succeed herself in office, but shall not serve more than two(2) consecutive terms within any five(5) year period. " This resolution makes obsolete and deletes ARTICLE XXII, Section D.

83RD TOLEDO, OHIO 2011

Moved to have all District Lodge Officers respond to invitations for chapter visitations.

49TH CINCINNATI, OHIO 1986

It is the responsibility of each district lodge officer to attend a minimum of 4 of the District Governor's official visitation meetings. It is their responsibility further to attend the District Convention. Meeting the two previous obligations the officer would receive full allocation. If only one obligation is met the officer will receive one half of their allocation. It is expected that lodge officers will attend district lodge meetings as called by the District Governor.

51ST LOUISVILLE, KY 1988

Be it resolved that the District Governor issue a minimum of five(5) bulletins.

56TH CANTON, OH 1993

The following recommendations were made:

1. Since we no longer publish a Buckeye Bulletin, the District Governor should put news items in her bulletins. For example, this year's illness and death of district lodge members. Passed.

Passed.

57TH NORTH ROYALTON, OH 1996

1. The committee would like to put into a motion that all required reports and forms for monetary requirements and others to be mailed to each chapter no later than January 30. Resolution approved.
2. The committee moves that the District Governor notify each chapter in her second bulletin as to which committee they have been assigned by December 30. (Recommendation to incoming District Governor.)
3. The committee moves that the various District Legislative Chairman network via fax or letter regarding changes so that a more united front be presented at National Convention.

58TH CLEVELAND, OH 1997

1. The lodge's travel listings be limited to Lodge meetings, chapter visitation, workshops, social engagements where officer is invited as a representative, conventions, and Governor's Seminar.
2. A form should be signed for the district assessments and donations which would be distributed by the treasurer annually to assist the chapters in meeting their obligations with clarity.

59TH COLUMBUS, OH 1998

1. Weekend visitations be at the discretion of the District Governor

1. weekend visitations be at the discretion of the District Governor.
2. Be it resolved that the District Lodge assign each Chapter a committee prior to the convention and further request that each chapter mail the chapter's recommendations to the Governor so that the working committees established at the convention have a basic foundation from which to work. Resolution Passed.

61ST YOUNGSTOWN, OH 2000

1. Be it recommended that when the District and National Conventions are over, the District Governor & National President see that the bulletins are sent out by the 1st of the month.
2. Be it recommended that forms be revised and updated:
 - a. made current

 - e. state when the form is due

DISTRICT WORKSHOP

28TH WARREN, OHIO 1965

A registration fee of not more than \$1.00 be charged at District Conclaves.

29TH COLUMBUS, OHIO 1966

One workshop to be held during the conclave.

31ST MIDDLETOWN, OHIO 1968

1. The District Conclave to be held over a period of two days instead of one.
2. We dispense with the workshop and that each District Lodge Officers who have been assigned a chapter be responsible to the President and their Secretaries as to their duties.

48TH NORTH ROYALTON, OHIO 1985

It was moved that the Daughters of Penelope allotment to the Maids of Athena be rescinded as long as the Maids are receiving money from the AHEPA.

51ST LOUISVILLE, KY 1988

1. Whereas it be resolved that each Chapter President without an active Maids chapter would be responsible to appoint a liaison recruiter with the intent to establish a Maids and this recruiter will report to the president and the president will in turn report on her end to the District Lodge.
2. Whereas increased support from the Daughters of Penelope to the Maids of Athena is essential, and whereas the membership of the Maids of Athena has increased substantially this year, be it therefore resolved that the Maids of Athena budget be supplemented more commensurate with the Sons of Pericles allotment. Rationale: In chapters throughout the country we are losing members. 2. Borderline chapters are folding. 3. Younger women have many choices in what type of organization they wish to join.

Recommendation: Within the next 5 years the DOP is asked to look at expenditures and try to insure fiscal responsibility.

PENELOPE OF THE YEAR

Recommendation: Applicants should have contributed on the Chapter and District levels for the Growth of the Order plus participate in events such as Festival of Tables, district convention, Governors' Ball, workshops, and seminars. Any National participation is a bonus.

86th CONVENTION CINCINNATI, OH- 2014

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE

There are concerns in many chapters that we have too many projects as well as voluntary projects. By spreading the available monies chapters have so thinly, no one project is truly benefiting. Many of our chapters have decreased in size due to demographic attrition as well as various other reasons. A major concern is the Daughters of Penelope Foundation, Inc. As a scholarship fund is a mandatory project and the scholarship fund is part of the Daughters of Penelope Foundation, Inc., chapters feel that the Foundation is reaping double benefits by both being mandatory.

PROPOSAL

1. Reduce the mandatory projects to a maximum of 3

Since National consistently changes the dates of the Supreme conventions to anywhere from the beginning of June to the end of July and the Districts are consistent with the dates of their respective conventions usually varying one week, or recommendation is to change the submission line from "...Please send completed form by "date" to Please send completed form no later than the third business day following the conclusion of the District Convention.
